HOW DOES IT WORK?

VDSS allows secondary students to gain practical skills in specific industries while contributing toward the completion of the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), including the VCE Vocational Major (VM).

The programs run from February to November, and some courses may require students to attend structured workplace learning (SWL) sessions during school holiday periods.

Students in year 10 will also have an opportunity to join our Taster program that will assist them with making a decision on the VDSS course they would like to partake in Year 11 and 12.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

The program offers several benefits, including contributing to high school requirements and improving chances of a good score, developing practical skills and experience, earning a nationally recognised qualification or credits towards one, and providing pathways to higher-level courses and apprenticeships.



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How To Be Successful In Your VDSS Program

To excel in your VDSS program, staying motivated and managing your time effectively are crucial. Be prepared to dive into new, hands-on learning and assessment methods that differ from traditional approaches, enhancing your immediate job skills. Strong communication skills are also essential for better learning and teamwork.

Most importantly, maintain a good balance between your studies, VDSS activities, work placements, part-time jobs, sports, and social life. Although it's challenging, achieving this balance is key to your success and well-being, helping you maximise your program benefits and prepare for future opportunities.

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EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND CARE*

CHC30121 Certificate III Early Childhood Education and Care*

WHAT DOES THIS COURSE INVOLVE?

This VCE VET program is ideal for people who want to make a difference in the lives of young children and families. During this partial completion program, you will learn from experienced and supportive trainers and participate in industry work placement. You will gain the skills and knowledge to:

- maintain a safe, clean and appealing environment;
- promote healthy eating and ensure that food and drinks provided are nutritious, appropriate for each child and prepared in a safe and hygienic manner;
- apply strategies to guide responsible behaviour of children and young people in a safe and supportive environment;
- provide children with opportunities to maximise their potential and develop a foundation for future success.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must be 15 years or over
- Must be attending Secondary School
- Successful completion of year 10

STUDY PATHWAYS

After completion of this program, you may wish to complete the remaining units in the Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care (CHC30121) to complete your qualification or apply for entry into the Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care (CHC50121).

CAREER OUTCOMES

To obtain employment opportunities as a Certificate III level educator you must be enrolled and working towards completion of the Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care (CHC30121) qualification. Work settings may include nanny, preschools/kindergartens, long day care, out of hours school care, recreation and mobile care services.

Students must complete at least 40 hours of work placement in year 1 and 40 hours of placement in year 2 within a regulated early childhood education and care service.

WHAT DOES THIS COURSE INVOLVE?

The logistics and warehousing industries are essential to Australia's supply chain. The introduction of new automation and tracking technologies are driving demand in the sector with an expected growth of 2.6% annually over the next five years.

This course covers a range of warehousing duties including safety, order picking, and receiving and dispatching of goods. You will also gain customer service skills within the logistics environment.

Completing this course provides you with hands-on experience and a nationally recognised qualification, preparing you for roles such as logistics clerk or administrative worker in the integrated logistics field.
